Mount Zion Church and Sunday School 1972

From 1972 until 2014/15, both Church and Sunday School Buildings continued to be used for regular meetings for Sunday and week-day meetings and activities by the departments of the Church and Outside Bodies.

The majority of activities, with the exception of Sunday Services and Choir Practices, took place in the Sunday School Building in Enfield Street.

These included:

Sunday School classes, Meetings and Children's Missions
Bible Study and Prayer Meetings
Christian Endeavour Meetings –these were often held in members' homes
Women's Auxiliary – Ladies' Devotional Meeting
Men's Fellowship Meetings
Children's Thursday Club Meetings
Coffee Mornings
Social Evenings,
Concerts,
Quiz Nights

and use by outside agencies including:

Judo Club
Mum and Toddler Club
Miss Sutcliffe's Dance School
Wigan Council – use for Social Services meetings and as
a Polling Station for local and General Elections

Throughout this time, necessary repairs and improvements including upgrades to the Stage Lighting equipment, installation of gas fires and electric infra-red wall heaters to the Primary class rooms, a new fitted Kitchen and Heating System in the Sunday School Building.

We thank God for His support and guidance over that last 150 years and trust that, by His grace, many more men, women, boys and girls will, come to a Personal Relationship with Him, through the example and witness of Mount Zion IM Church.

Looking to the Future!

Since our foundation in 1872, our objective, as a Christian fellowship, has been, and still is, to provide a Place of Christian Worship which serves our community.

Throughout the years we have honoured our commitment to spreading the Gospel of Salvation through the Lord Jesus Christ and have endeavoured to offer the "hand of fellowship and friendship" to all we meet.

We have always enjoyed good relationships with other local church fellowships and have engaged in shared social and spiritual events, to our mutual benefit.

We have all felt the effects of the Covid19 pandemic in some way or another, yet, during this period we have strengthened our links within our own and other local church fellowships, through our weekly **e.mail** and **Facebook Services**, monthly **Newsletter**, and having set up a "**What'sApp**" group and a **Facebook** page (and soon hope to have our own **Website**)

The friendliness and warmth of our fellowship is often commented upon by visitors to our church.

In the recent past, resulting from the success of our regular weekly **Coffee Morning**, and through an initiative supported by Wigan MBC, we launched "**MOZAIC**", a drop-in Dementia Café, offering activities to sufferers and short respite periods for their carers. Unfortunately, the uptake was very poor and the café closed after a period of one year.

The repurposing and remodelling of the Church interior provided us with greater flexibility in its use so that the activities that we originally held in the Sunday School Hall have, in the main, transferred well to their "new home" in the Church building – the only casualties being **Miss Sutcliffe's Academy of Dance** and the **Judo Club**, which have found new homes elsewhere, the closure of the **Christian Endeavour** and **Men's Fellowship** groups (due to lack of members) and **Thursday Club** [Youth Club] (as most of our Sunday School Scholars are still too young to attend). Our hope is that, when the "time is right" that the **Thursday Club** will be re-introduced.

A warm invitation to all our activities is extended to all.

A Time for Change

In 2014, with attendance in decline and remedial works required on both Church and Sunday School, the decision to have both buildings inspected was taken.

As expected, both buildings required considerable repair and the decision was taken to dispose of the Sunday School and use the monies realised to refurbish and repurpose our facilities in the "New" (1934) Church building

Mount Zion IM Church has had a long-standing relationship with Pemberton Old (Wigan) Bands who purchased the Sunday School Building for conversion for use as a Band Room, Practice and Performance Venue – thus keeping the "suite of Buildings" intact.

An extensive programme of alterations, including re-ordering, overseen by the Executive, was planned, in consultation with Architects, **Schafer Associates** of Ashton, and approved by the membership over a series of meetings.

The works commenced, in Spring of 2016, with the removal of the fixed pews, sanding, sealing and varnishing the floor and installation of upholstered chairs.

The pulpit was later dismantled and the re-claimed timber used to construct a screen to provide a storage area for chairs and tables, in part of the North Transept alcove.

Both WCs at the East end of the church were refurbished, redecorated and the Sanitary ware replaced. The Cloakroom/kitchen area at the West end of church was converted into a WC with full "disabled access"

In order that the work of the Sunday School would not be interrupted by the disposal of the Sunday School building, the former Minister's Vestry was refurbished. This involved completely rebuilding the bay window, including brickwork and window frame, replacement of the roof and light fitting. redecorating and recarpeting.

The former Choir Vestry was redecorated and refitted to serve as an Office and/or Meeting Room.

A new Tea-bar/Catering area, necessary electrical supplies for appliances were designed and installed at the rear of Church, by Elite Kitchens. The Sound and Loop Systems were upgraded by Makerfield Installations and the interior lighting by the men of the

Facade refitted

The fabric of the large West Gable Tracery Window was, as part of the Structural Inspections, found to be in such a poor condition that the decision to replace it, with a double glazed, hard wooden unit (as the cost of a like for like replacement would have been far too expensive), was taken; the works being carried out by Abbey Windows.

The remaining windows to the East Gable and the North and South elevations were also replaced with brown upvc frames with "decorated" triple glazed units, two of which have locking "opening lights" to provide ventilation.

To provide a further Meeting room for the Sunday School, it was later decided to remove the 1917 Pendlebury Pipe Organ and convert the "Organ Loft".

The design and oversight by Mike Allen, while all the removal, construction, reinstatement of the facade and decoration works were carried out by the men of the church.
